For 2021, the Per Capita assessment for the Presbytery of Cincinnati is \$35 per person. Multiply this amount by each church member of your household to determine your correct contribution. The suggested amount for the Initial Offering is \$5.00.

***Per Capita** is a set amount of money (apportionment) per member that congregations pay to the larger Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Every Presbyterian shares in the benefit of the PC(USA)'s system of government, so every Presbyterian is asked to share the expenses associated with coordinating and performing the functions of that system. Congregations (through their sessions) pay an annual amount of money per church member — per capita apportionment — to their presbyteries. The annual per capita amount is a combined request from a congregation's presbytery, synod, and the General Assembly — based on their respective budgets for the coming year.
