#### Kitchen Cleaning This Friday Morning


The kitchen crew will be back this **Friday morning (August 13)** at 9am to finish up cleaning cabinets, drawers and the fridge. All are welcome to join.

#### Author Talk at St. Barnabas Episcopal Church

St Barnabas Episcopal Church (10345 Montgomery Rd.) invites the MPC congregation to an author talk, Tuesday August 31 at 6:00pm. Chuck Burroughs has struggled his whole life with Central Auditory Processing Disorder and multiple other learning and mental disorders. He was raised with an unyielding father and teachers and classmates who didn't understand his intellectual limitations. He attended strict fundamentalist churches that promoted the idea of perfection before God, which sparked a severe bout of Obsessive-Compulsive Disorder with which he still struggles today. Eventually, Burroughs taught himself to read, graduated from high school and college, married, had a family, and started a successful construction business. He studied many religious disciplines before finally finding his own understanding of the Bible. Amazingly, at the age of 81, Burroughs has written his memoir, which tells how he managed to tame his various disabilities, find joy in life, and learn to help others suffering from similar emotional and mental difficulties.
